Expert Consultation REPORT



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Introduction

Promoting inclusive and equitable learning practices is more urgent than ever and critical to fulfilling the 2030 Agenda's Sustainable Development Goal 4 - quality inclusive and equitable education - and the EU Inclusion and Diversity Strategy.

The three core principles of the EduChampions project are as follows:

- learner diversity is viewed through the Universal Design for Learning framework, presuming that all learners have unique requirements and methods for interacting with, comprehending, and communicating knowledge;
- effective strategies for addressing the diversity of learners depend on striking a balance between all-encompassing learner-centred pedagogies and
- pertinent digital tools that are intentionally used.

In his context, edupreneurs are essential change agents who inspire, foster, and maintain change in education throughout time.

For this reason, the partnership implemented a consultation process of local experts in their country (trainers, educational consultants, strategists, and educators) in order to identify the most significant inspiring educators and pedagogical, technological and educational practices at national level.

The purpose of this document is to summarise the national consultation processes and its results.

Expert consultation process

DISRUPTIA, as leader of the WP3, provided partners with guidelines and template to develop this action.

Each partner consulted at least 5 local experts among educators, trainers, educational consultants, and strategists and "edupreneurs". These experts were contacted through universities, VET teaching centres, educational centres, etc.

The experts were provided with a survey which includes the following questions:

- Project presentation (quick background, objectives, partners, products)
- What does it mean to you to be an "edupreneur"?
- What do you think the pedagogical pathway or pedagogical framework that an "edupreneur" follows in their practice should look like to address inclusion and all individual needs in their classroom (to refer to Universal Design for Learning)?
- What digital tools do "edupreneurs" use to enhance an active role in the learning process (to refer to "Technological and pedagogical content knowledge")?
- What key competences do "edupreneurs" have to develop a role as champions of change in education?
- After these questions... Do you know an edupreneur?

After the expert consultation, each partner identified 2 "edupreneurs" to be interviewed during the next phase of the project.

On the one hand, people can have work experience, that is, having a track record in the sector (for example, being an education teacher) or, on the other hand, their own experience. I consider it essential to have established knowledge at a conceptual and formative level, although it does not have to be in formal education. (Can be acquired by other means).

Individualized, taking into account the people and not an orientation towards the group

- The pedagogical framework of an edupreneur to address inclusion :
 - Knowledge of individual needs: Become familiar with the diverse needs and individual characteristics of your students.
 - Curriculum adaptation: Adjust the curriculum and teaching approach to meet the individual needs of your students.
 - Inclusive Environment: Create a welcoming and respectful classroom environment, where all students feel valued and accepted.
 - Use of Technology: Use technology effectively to support inclusion and individual needs.
 - Collaboration and support: Work closely with other education professionals, such as school psychologists, therapists... to identify and address the individual needs of students.
 - Formative Assessment: Conduct formative and ongoing assessments to monitor each student's progress and make adjustments to your teaching approach.
 - Open Communication: Maintain open and ongoing communication with students, their families, and other members of the educational team.
 - The pedagogical path towards inclusion and support for individual needs is a continuous process, therefore, flexibility, empathy and a willingness to adapt are key qualities to promote inclusion in the classroom as an edupreneur.  - This approach allows teaching strategies, materials and assessments to be adapted to meet the individual needs of learners, ensuring that all learners can access and engage with the content
- Include Culturally Responsive Teaching.
 - Acknowledging and valuing students' cultural backgrounds, experiences and perspectives is crucial to fostering inclusion.
 - Edupreneurs can adopt culturally responsive teaching practices by incorporating diverse resources, fostering multicultural perspectives in the curriculum, and creating a classroom environment that celebrates and respects students' identities.

In order to address inclusion and individual needs in their classroom, an edupreneur should consider the following in their pedagogical framework:

- **Differentiated Instruction:** Edupreneurs should employ strategies that accommodate diverse learning styles, abilities, and backgrounds. This involves adapting teaching methods, providing varied learning materials, and offering multiple pathways for students to access and engage with the content.
- **Universal Design for Learning (UDL):** Incorporating UDL principles allows edupreneurs to create inclusive learning environments by providing multiple means of representation, action, and expression. This framework ensures that instructional materials, activities, and assessments are accessible and adaptable to meet the needs of all learners.
- **Collaborative and Cooperative Learning:** Edupreneurs should foster a classroom culture that encourages collaboration and cooperation among students. By incorporating group projects, peer learning, and cooperative activities, they promote teamwork, communication, and the sharing of diverse perspectives, thereby enhancing inclusivity and promoting a sense of belonging for all learners.

- Every culture has its own way of life. When I was in the United States, I had a chance to work in Montessori schools and I think Montessori has a sense of the perfect texture of teaching a language.
- I think as a Turkish person Maria Montessori should give us an example of being an Anatolium educator. Giving the children the texture of the language culture at first.
- Maria Montessori's approach is more family oriented and modest to give love and sense in baby steps.
- My philosophy is learning with baby steps and taking it slowly

When you plan a lesson, you can't think in one way. You have to think about other students, too, because we have some learners who learn by hearing, listening, kinesthetic activities and being a part of the lesson. So, you have to cover all learners. So that you can be successful at the end of the path.

First of all you have to know your students who you are referring to. You should be able to shift your skills. Being able to be good at your work.

Being able to use technology in an effective way. If you are teaching face to face, you can reach a maximum of 30 students but when you are on the internet, the whole world is underneath you. You can reach everyone by internet, websites, platforms and applications. Because in this modern world, people love colors and visuals. People don't like those books. The black mirror is charming and great way of teaching.

GREECE

I agree about the utilisation of the UDL.

Must use inclusive teaching methods and differentiated teaching strategies

The UDL, I believe, refers to instructions for trainees to follow in order to achieve the educational objectives of a training programme. It is a set of guidelines which may be followed by an edupreneur in order to meet the needs of all trainees. However, I believe that personalised learning is also a practice that is aimed at and tailored to each individual learner. With personalised learning, it adapts the educational program to the needs of the needs of the student, making it more flexible. This method ensures the integration and the needs mentioned in the question above.

Technology offers a wealth of tools that can be used in education to enhance the interaction and active participation of learners. Also, the addition of experiential activities makes the impact of the educational conclusions.

I think that first of all, we need proper training on the tools that we want to use (e.g. coaching), as well as on tools - skills that support the provision of our services (e.g. Zoom, public speaking, communication, etc.). Then, through practice of our knowledge, it is good to come up with our own pedagogical process, which becomes our competitive advantage

I think the idea of linking UDL with Applied Behavior Analysis is the an appropriate pedagogical framework for edupreneurs. In more detail, according to the NAC, the Students learn to make a simple correlation between cause and effect. With repetition, a student learns to associate a correct action with a reward. As a result, therefore, that correct choice will be repeated as the incorrect action does not earn a reward. When not rewarded, behaviours begin to fade slowly, a process known as extinction.

The use of technology to encourage behaviors is ideal, as anyone can rewarded over and over again without everyone seeing it and creating an unfair competition.

In combination, UDL using parallel alternative methods of display can include in the educational process all educational needs and, above all, help to leave behind the concept of 'dry' lectures so that the learner can interact with the teacher almost throughout the whole lesson.

More specifically, in order to achieve this objective, there should be a rotation throughout the lecture visual and audio material, rewarded tests, online games with rewards and simultaneous experiential groups

I think that education in Greece exists and can exist in very specific contexts that concern and influence the activity of an edupreneur to the extent that it is difficult to impossible to apply methodologies and frameworks as mentioned in the question. You need a major change in the whole context in order to be able to follow corresponding methods. Certainly, I see in young colleagues - especially adult educators – the adoption of new tools and perhaps even methods (such as behavioural learning, the reverse classroom etc.).

The one of inclusive education

CYPRUS

I think the framework must include:

- existing practices
- examples of new practices
- examples for addressing inclusion and individual needs in a variety of different situations in the teaching and learning process

Inclusion, it requires a pedagogical framework that is adaptable to the diverse learning needs and backgrounds of students. By following a pedagogical pathway or framework like the one below, edupreneurs can create an inclusive learning environment that meets the needs of all learners and supports their academic and social growth.

Differentiation of learning (and all similar terms that you will find in literature such as individualisation, personalisation)

- launch innovative pedagogical pathways that address all learners needs and approaches
- Using inclusive pedagogies for learning and differentiation (Universal Design for Learning, Differentiation of Instruction),
- Be in a better position to find innovative solutions for presenting the teaching material, engaging students in the learning process and enabling them to act and express than a conventional educator with no business knowledge.

- To ensure quality and equity in education
- To establish an inclusive school and classroom environment offering opportunities for all students
- Enchanting the development of all children to reach their full potential
- To establish a clear school vision and framework with principles about the management of individual needs and the promotion of inclusion.

ITALY

The model of the Universal Design for Learning is absolutely a good tool and framework to be applied in order to address inclusion and to meet all the students' individual needs. This way of designing and managing educational practice allows to meet the different learning methods and conditions existing in different contexts. An edupreneur should follow this kind of model to ensure an educational personalization through a flexible and inclusive approach, thus enabling equal opportunity and equity of learning for all learners.

The Edupreneur should follow a pedagogical framework that ensures to reach all the learners within the learning process. The problem is the presence of many people active in the field of education who, despite having a broad educational background, are unable to relate to the young people or the target audience because they lack communication skills or are anchored in traditional and uninspiring teaching methodologies

Yes, adapted to a local context such as Italy, moreover regional one by sectorializing the reference verticals reliably and from the right creative mix create measurable outputs on the reference classes, such as KPI's and motivational forecasts.

Pay attention to the activities of communication, organization and human resource management.

An enterprising trainer who prefers a collaborative educational approach linked to goals to be achieved together

- Each person learns differently because our history is different and different are the emotional, behavioural, neurological, and cultural factors that set us apart.
- Pedagogical knowledge should "crash into" education systems, which are still so rigid and sometimes archaic to make education inclusive, removing various obstacles to learning so that each person feels comfortable while learning (we know how important the emotional side is!).

LATVIA

The pedagogical framework is set up in a way that is the most appropriate for the target group (learners), including methods that facilitate inclusivity and emphasis on specific learners' needs.

An educational specialist who deals with issues related to inclusiveness and individual needs in the learning process must have basic knowledge in psychology and medicine.

An edupreneur's pedagogical framework for addressing inclusion and individual needs in the classroom should follow Universal Design for Learning (UDL). UDL focuses on providing multiple ways to represent information, engage students, and allow for various means of expression and action, ensuring all learners can succeed.

Pedagogical education and understanding of the learners' special needs are necessary in order to be able to match the learner's abilities with the learning content
